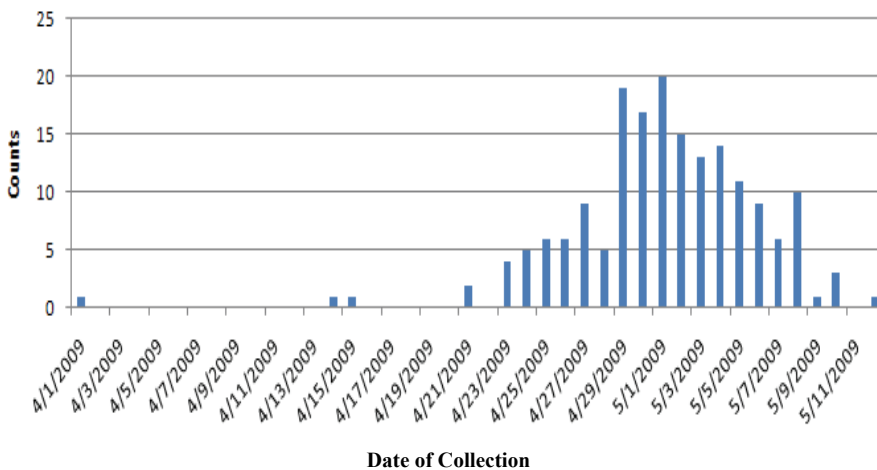
DoD Summary

NAVY: One new case identified from Naval Health Clinic New England, RI (FM-32 year old female). This case represents the first Navy beneficiary from the Northeast United States to be laboratory confirmed.

AIR FORCE: Two new cases from Lackland AFB, TX (AD-26 year old male, FM-59 year old female) and 1 new case from Andrews AFB, MD (FM-9 year old female) have been identified by the Air Force; the first cases from both locations.

MARINES: Four additional recruits have been identified at MCRD-San Diego; bringing the total number of cases to 12.

AFHSC REPORTING

The AFHSC will now report confirmed and probable H1N1 cases together in keeping with emerging guidance from the CDC. Decentralized testing through DoD and non-DoD reference laboratories will result in AFHSC and service points of contact reporting cases based on the confirmatory results from these reference laboratories. Service-specific numbers should be used to guide public health actions at respective military facilities. Active contact tracing and isolation of cases should occur as soon as possible based on results from any laboratory validated to perform confirmatory testing for the novel influenza A/H1N1.
