The AFHSC, in collaboration with various interagency partners, is developing a strategy for monitoring and evaluating the safety and effectiveness of any future vaccine for the novel influenza A/H1N1 virus.

#### DoD Daily Case Summary

**ARMY:** One 25 year old male (REC) was identified from Fort Jackson, SC through testing at NHRC

**NAVY:** One 12 year old female (FM) was identified from the Naval Health Clinic in Hawaii

**AIR FORCE:** One 35 year old female (AD) from Langley AFB was identified by the Virginia State Public Health Laboratory

**MARINES:** *Correction:* Three previously reported "probable" cases among RECs at MCRD-SD have been ruled out

**COAST GUARD:** One 23 year old male (AD) from CGC Jarvis (San Francisco, CA) was identified as a case by the State of Hawaii while TAD to Honolulu, HI

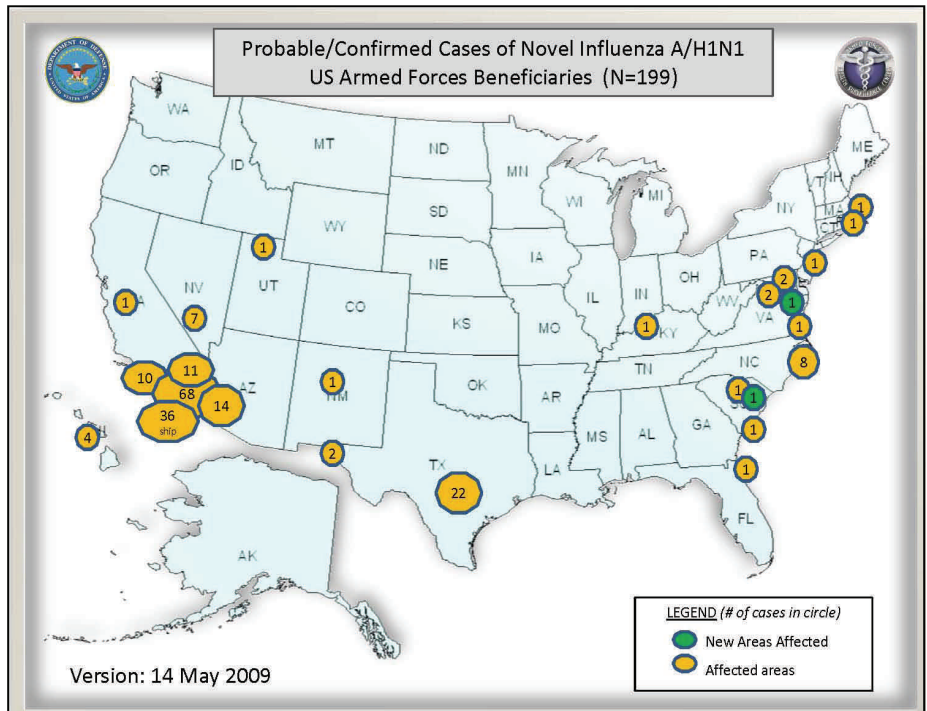

#### AFHSC REPORTING

The AFHSC will now report confirmed and probable H1N1 cases together in keeping with emerging guidance from the CDC. Decentralized testing through DoD and non-DoD reference laboratories will result in AFHSC and service points of contact reporting cases based on the confirmatory results from these reference laboratories. Service-specific numbers should be used to guide public health actions at respective military facilities. Active contact tracing and isolation of cases should occur as soon as possible based on results from any laboratory validated to perform confirmatory testing for the novel influenza A/H1N1.
