DoD ESSENCE: ESSENCE documents overall MHS and CONUS stabilization of clinic visits for Influenza-like illness (ILI) at the low levels typical for midsummer. Several installations though, including Parris Island, Ft. Jackson, and the United States Air Force Academy have increased ILI clinic visits.

USS Boxer: The Navy Environmental Preventive Medicine Unit—Five is leading an investigation of the recent outbreak of pandemic influenza aboard the USS Boxer.

United States Air Force Academy: The USAFSAM epidemiology team is currently analyzing the environmental and serial shedding samples from their investigation of the ongoing outbreak among cadets and support staff at the USAFA.
