**ESSENCE** - Clinic visits for ILI during the last week have stabilized across the MHS at a level consistent with the summer nadir of such encounters. One exception was Colorado, where the H1N1 outbreak at the AF Academy coincided with a more than 200% increase in clinic visits for ILI during the weeks ending 11 and 18 July, compared to clinic visits during the preceding 6 weeks. Academy clinic visits for ILI reached 59% of the total for all DoD MTFs in Colorado, compared to its usual contribution of 29% during the preceding 14 weeks.

**Southeast Regional Medical Command Area** - As reported below, includes confirmed cases from Ft. Gordon, Ft. McPherson, Ft. Stewart, and their satellite clinics. This region was previously reported as Ft. Gordon which hosts the Eisenhower Army Medical Center and thus serves as a sample submission hub.
