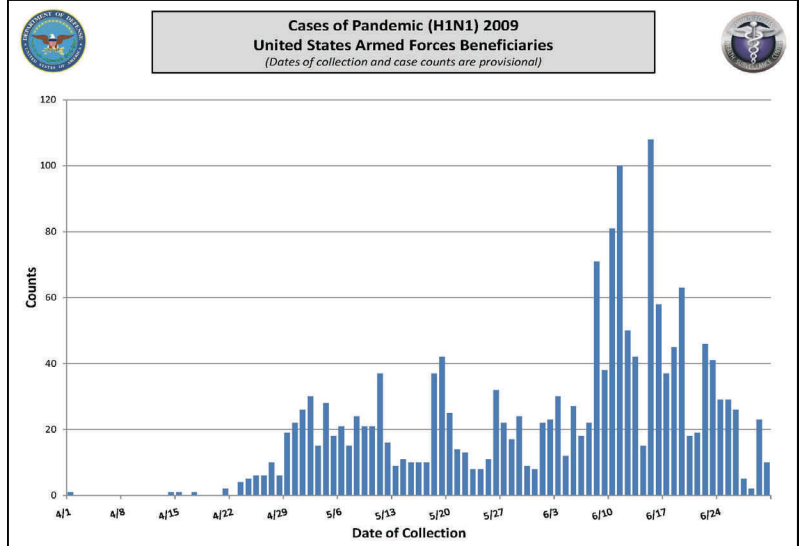

**ESSENCE Monitoring:** A continued decline in clinic visits is observed for influenza-like illness (ILI) in most of the Military Health System (MHS). Clinic visits for ILI remain above expected levels in Hawaii, where CDC has reported widespread influenza activity.

**NMCPHC:** Monitoring of pharmacy data throughout the MHS during week 26 (June 28-July 4) shows that 93% of all prescribed antiviral medications were for oseltamivir (Tamiflu). This trend over the past 11 weeks suggests a shift from treatment practices during the past influenza season where zanamivir and oseltamivir were prescribed in equal proportions.
